Building Positive Team Culture: Step Up to the Plate Coaching Workshop Recap

On Sunday, June 22nd, Toronto Playgrounds proudly hosted the Step Up to the Plate Coaching Workshop at MLSE LaunchPad. This hands-on session gave our volunteer coaches an incredible opportunity to explore what it takes to build a positive and inclusive team culture – a core value at TP.

Rooted in the findings of the MLSE Foundation's Change the Game research project, the workshop sparked thoughtful discussion, boosted coaching confidence, and offered practical strategies to support player development both on and off the field. The research project examines youth sport access, engagement, and equity, guiding investments and initiatives to create a better future for youth sport.

With over 25,000 participants to date, MLSE plans to engage an additional 10,000–15,000 diverse youth voices aged 6–29 in the coming month, including youth who don't currently play sports. To support this mission, we encourage you to share the survey with youth and their parents/guardians. Participation helps transform sport culture through evidence–based interventions and investments. We are grateful to everyone who attended and contributed to such a meaningful day. The energy, ideas, and commitment to growth were truly inspiring.
